

From Pastor Steve's Desk...

(This is the next installment of an ongoing series of articles regarding what we believe, why we believe it, and why it matters. In the United Methodist Church, there is change coming. Within our global denomination, we have some serious divergent views on the authority of scripture, human sexuality, and what that means in the world and in our church. We aren't sure what the changes will look like, but we know that in order to respond to God's call to be the church in the 21st century, the anchor of our doctrinal identity, we need to know what that is. So, I invite you to join me on this journey for God's glory and to build up the church.)

...on doctrine...

Part 11 - Of Works of Supererogation

You're probably asking, "What in the world is supererogation?" Don't feel bad - I had to ask the same question. In short, supererogation is the doctrine that the Christian believer can *do* more good stuff in order to earn salvation faster than if you didn't do those works. Our Wesleyan heritage rejects that doctrine, relying on humble faith alone for salvation and viewing good works as the fruit of that salvation.

Here's what Article of Religion 11 says about this: Voluntary works - besides, over and above God's commandments - which they call works of supererogation, cannot be taught without arrogance and impiety. For by them men do declare that they do not only render unto God as much as they are bound to do, but that they do more for his sake than of bounded duty is required; whereas Christ saith plainly: When you have done all that is commanded you, say, We are unprofitable servants. (From The Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church - 2004. Copyright 2004 by The United Methodist Publishing House.)

The 'they' that is referred to in the Articles is the Roman Catholic tradition, whose doctrines do include works of supererogation. The aim of this article is not to refute the doctrine in the Roman Catholic tradition, since I honestly don't know the finer points of it. The aim is to encourage us with the salvation that comes from Jesus. In fact, since we are in the season of Lent, we are fully beginning to once again relive the story of how and why God sent Jesus to die on the Cross for our salvation.

Doing good works, as we talked about in a previous article, is an outward sign of an inward assurance of salvation. Could we do more? Of course! Are we called to do more? Of course! Will anything we DO offer us a better chance of salvation? Nope! Because God sent Jesus into the world as fully human and fully divine, there is NOTHING that we can DO to earn faster, better, or more complete salvation. We only believe.

The celebration of Easter is coming, and we have been thankful for the ministries and mission of the church. We have been on a Road Trip with Jesus. Our job now is not to work really hard to make sure Jesus

comes back, either this Easter or for eternity. Our job is to be willing and open vessels to receive the salvation He offers and then respond in love.

There aren't too many days that get us as excited as Easter Sunday. As we worship this season, and grow in our discipleship, may our responses give glory to the God who shines a light in the world in Jesus.

Happy Lent! Happy Easter! Wherever you are when you read this, stop and give God glory for Jesus! That's what we CAN do that God receives with great joy!
