

From Pastor Steve's Desk...

(This is the next installment of an ongoing series of articles regarding what we believe, why we believe it, and why it matters. In the United Methodist Church, there is change coming. Within our global denomination, we have some serious divergent views on the authority of scripture, human sexuality, and what that means in the world and in our church. We aren't sure what the changes will look like, but we know that in order to respond to God's call to be the church in the 21st century, the anchor of our doctrinal identity, we need to know what that is. So, I invite you to join me on this journey for God's glory and to build up the church.)

...on doctrine...

Part 12 - Of Sin after Justification

The German Pietists with whom John Wesley had a relationship in the middle of the 18th century believed that once a person was born again, that person could not sin. If they did sin after conversion, it was a sign that they were not truly saved. John Wesley had a issue with that, knowing that he himself continued to be a sinner, but who was also assured of his salvation by faith in Jesus Christ. The next Article we will examine is number 12 - sin after justification.

Here's what Article of Religion 12 says about this: Not every sin willingly committed after justification is the sin against the Holy Ghost, and unpardonable. Wherefore, the grant of repentance is not to be denied to such as fall into sin after justification. After we have received the Holy Ghost, we may depart from grace given, and fall into sin, and, by the Grace of God, rise again and amend our lives. And therefore the place of forgiveness to such as truly repent. (From The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church - 2016. Copyright 2016 by The United Methodist Publishing House).

After the Fall of humans, sin entered the world and became a huge problem for all those who came after Adam and Eve. Sin is pervasive and enters into everything that we do. Prior to the new birth that comes from believing in your heart that Jesus died for your sin and that you can be forgiven, sin is all you know. In fact, you aren't really even aware that sin dominates and reigns in your life. It's as if we all just take it for granted.

After accepting the free gift of God's grace for salvation through Jesus Christ, sin becomes apparent in your life. You awaken to the fact that you're a sinner and that sin destroys the relationship you have with God. You are unholy, unclean, and yet have a desire to change that status. Enter Jesus. God gave us His only son so that we could be free from the punishment of our sin, not so that we would never sin again. It's just not practical.

Now, does this mean that we can sin as much as we want, since we'll sin anyway? I mean, if we are sinners, why don't we then just sin? NO! When we are regenerated by Jesus, we are made holy by the blood of Jesus. Being holy compels us to stop sinning and express our righteousness with signs of that salvation. The outward signs of that holiness are the love of God and love of our neighbors.

When we are born again, though we continue to sin, that sin does not reign over us...we are freed (continued on next page)

from the bondage of sin. So even though we sin because of the Fall's affect on us, that sin is reduced as we increase in faith. God gives us the free gift of salvation...our response is to increase in faith throughout our lives.

May this season be the beginning of something wonderful in your life. May your sin decrease, may your hold living increase, and may the love of God be cast abroad in your heart and life. Blessings!

Bible Quiz Nationals!

We had an amazing six days together at the National Bible Quiz Fellowship Tournament in Green Lake, Wisconsin. We had 21 quizzers and 13 adults from the Family Life Quiz League form three teams with coaches and table officials (time keepers, score keepers, and quiz masters). We enjoyed worship and speakers each morning followed by lots of quizzing. Every one of our quizzers answered at least two questions correctly. We learned to function as a team and to persevere even when faced with teams that just blew our socks off! There were 278 total quizzers on 41 teams. Our three teams finished 11th, 19th. And 33rd. All of our quizzers will be back next year and some have even started looking at the material! We will be studying Mark, Hebrews and 1st and 2nd Peter. The 2020 National Tournament will be held in Pittsburgh, April 14-18th. Thank you PUMC family for supporting and praying for us.

Building Update from the PUMC Trustees Craig Vollmer, Chair

I wanted to update you on some blessings and challenges concerning our church building. As many of you know, we had repeated problems with the sanctuary roof, but were blessed to be able to fix them during the CenterPoint construction. Despite that, we discovered a serious leak around the bell tower. You may have seen the water damage upstairs, and are wondering why we haven't repaired it yet. We fixed the bell tower roofing, but have since found a masonry problem causing continued leaking. Plans are in motion to make that repair; once fixed, we can repair the water damage inside.

A few weeks ago, we discovered that one of the tandem furnaces for the old church has some problems that cannot be repaired. This is not surprising; they are over 40 years old. While not ideal, we were able to re-task the remaining one to heat everything. The good news is that this is an opportunity to replace both furnaces with a single one that can handle the entire space and do so with much greater efficiency and lower cost. They have served us well, but have reached the end of their usable life.

With the expansion of our parking lot, we were able to upgrade our lighting, and it has never been better lit. However, we found that the new lighting did not full cover the parking lot off the end of the sanctuary, leaving a poorly lit area on the street side. While we would ideally like to add another pole to match the others, it was not planned into the budget, so we are also considering the alternative of installing a light on the peak of the sanctuary. This is important for safety and security.

We hired a landscape architect last fall to develop a landscaping plan for the entire church, new and old. Our goals were simple: we want it to be beautiful, easy to maintain, perennial, diverse, and deer resistant. The plan meets these goals and is an opportunity to bring consistency to the entire church. We are in the process of reviewing it and expect to approve it at our May meeting.

I share all of this with you because while we are entering an exciting period in the history of our church with our new addition, the old church still requires attention. Unfortunately, the costs to address these new challenges exceed available funds. We have approximately \$20,000 in the trustees capital account, but these repairs will cost approximately \$65,000-\$70,000:

Bell tower masonry repairs - \$16,000 Interior water damage repairs - \$15,000 Furnace replacement - \$10,000 Parking lot lighting - pole (\$7,000) or peak light (\$2,500) Landscaping - \$22,000

Sadly, Ruth Russ, a long time PUMC members, passed away last year, but I am pleased to share that she graciously blessed us with a gift of \$5,000 in her will; church council decided to deposit those funds into the Trustees capital account to help address these challenges, bringing total available funds to \$25,000. Thank you, Ruth.

Our shortfall is \$40,000 - \$45,000. But as any responsible steward is called to do, we have prioritized these projects. The furnace and bell tower masonry repairs are the highest priorities and are in process. Unfortunately, these two projects will bring the capital account balance to zero. The water damage repairs will be the next priority, but will have to be put on hold until enough funds become available. Likewise, the parking lot lighting will be put on hold. The full landscaping plan will be put on hold as well, but for now, we will mulch and maintain the existing gardens, and the new construction will have top soil and grass seed put down as is required by our contractor; we will pursue the landscaping in part or whole when funds become available. These challenges aside, for the first time that I know of, we find ourselves without a capital safety net; it will take a long time to replenish.

I know that a lot has been asked of everyone over the last couple of years; your giving has been amazing, and we have accomplished much and have much of which to be proud. I would ask you to pray on these new challenges and if you are able to offer any financial aid to this situation, we would be grateful for any contributions you can make to the Trustees capital Account. Please feel free to contact any of the trustees, or me, with questions. Thank you for understanding.

Parish Nurse Recipe Yummy Healthy Egg Salad

10 hard boiled eggs, peeled and chopped coarsely

1/4 c. Hellman's light mayo

1/4 c. nonfat plain Greek yogurt + 2 tbsp

1 tbsp yellow mustard

1/4 c. chopped green onion (optional)

1/2 tsp. celery salt

1/4 tsp. smoked paprika

2 tsp. honey or sugar (or sweetener of choice) Salt and pepper to taste

In a bowl, combine all ingredients until combined fairly well. Cover and refrigerate 20 minutes to allow ingredients to mingle.

Serve with bread or rolls of choice.
