From Pastor Steve's Desk...

(This is the next installment of an ongoing series of articles regarding what we believe, why we believe it, and why it matters. In the United Methodist Church, there is change coming. Within our global denomination, we have some serious divergent views on the authority of scripture, human sexuality, and what that means in the world and in our church. We aren't sure what the changes will look like, but we know that in order to respond to God's call to be the church in the 21st century, the anchor of our doctrinal identity, we need to know what that is. So, I invite you to join me on this journey for God's glory and to build up the church.)

...on doctrine...

Part 13 - Of the Church

What does it mean to be the church? Does it mean that we have lots of potluck dinners and great children's programs? Does it mean that all those who are worthy can come together to be served by the church? Or is it something else? Sadly, many churches look more like civic organizations whose main purpose is to help people, instead of providing the opportunity to be transformed by Jesus Christ.

John Wesley conceived the church on two levels. Within the church, there are those who are true Christians (the invisible church), and those who are not yet Christians. The visible church includes all those who are attending worship and are involved in the ministry of the church in some way. Within that group is the <u>in</u>visible church, those who do all those things, but who have true faith in Jesus Christ and have the Holy Spirit living in them. This occurs in both the local church and in the church universal around the world, no matter what denomination. Now that we have an idea of WHO is the church, WHAT is the purpose of the church?

Here's what Article of Religion 13 says about this: The visible church of Christ is a congregation of faithful men [and women] in which the pure Word of God is preached, and the Sacraments duly administered according to Christ's ordinance, in all those things that of necessity are requisite to the same. (From The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church - 2004. Copyright 2016 by The United Methodist Publishing House.)

So it appears that the purpose of the church is simple: preach the Word and administer the two Sacraments of Holy Communion and Baptism. However, just like any good job description, there is always a line that reads something like, "...and other duties as deemed necessary." In the case of the church, the *response* to preaching the Word and administering the Sacraments is the juicy part of ministry. It's where ministry is done, experienced, illumined, and received.

When the Word is preached in our worship and discipleship, ministry happens. When adults and infants are baptized, we walk together through the doorway to ministry. When Holy Communion is administered by the pastor for the church, we are filled with a burning desire to love God and our neighbors. There is nothing more fundamental to the mission and outreach of the church than true, faithful believers in Jesus Christ engaging in the living Word and the Sacraments. In <u>these</u> are the direct lines we have with Christ, the Apostles, and the early church. In <u>these</u> are our commands to continue the rituals of the church, as Christ did. In *these* are life and vitality for the church today!

Being the church today in our society is unpopular and, in many ways, counter-cultural. Yet, being the church today is diverse and exciting because Jesus is leading us into the deepwater of faith and service. Our only hope for today and tomorrow is to first, and foremost, proclaim and hear the significance of Jesus' example for the Sacraments. From there, everything else is a response to what God has done for salvation, transformation, and glorification. Praise God that we don't have to make it up on our own.
