From Pastor Steve's Desk...

(This is the next installment of an ongoing series of articles regarding what we believe, why we believe it, and why it matters. **In the United Methodist Church, there is change coming.** Within our global denomination, we have some serious divergent views on the authority of scripture, human sexuality, and what that means in the world and in our church. We aren't sure what the changes will look like, but we know that in order to respond to God's call to be the church in the 21st century, the anchor of our doctrinal identity, we need to know what that is. So, I invite you to join me on this journey for God's glory and to build up the church.)

...on doctrine...

Part 14 - Of Purgatory

For many of us who have been Protestant for our entire lives, the Roman Catholic doctrine of purgatory may seem foreign and unknown. According to Roman Catholic doctrine, purgatory is the state of cleansing or purification prior to admittance into heaven. The Roman Catholic Church asserts that for those souls who have not been freed of sin, this cleansing process is necessary, and can be affected by the prayers and supplications of the living church. For United Methodists, the doctrine of purgatory is rejected based on the foundational theological underpinnings of scripture and faith as conditions for salvation.

Here's what Article of Religion 14 says about this: The Romish doctrine concerning purgatory, pardon, worshiping and adoration, as well of images as of relics, and also invocation of saints, is a fond thing, vainly invented, and grounded upon no warrant of Scripture, but repugnant to the Word of God. *(From The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church - 2016. Copyright 2004 by The United Methodist Publishing House.)*

This article isn't meant to be a criticism of this doctrine, held by millions of Roman Catholics around the world. However, it's meant to highlight the fact that faith and scripture are the primary conditions for eternity with God. Since the Bible doesn't talk about the concept of purgatory, we're not bound by this doctrine as a condition for faith.

In reality, we don't know for sure what happens when a person dies. What the Bible tells us is that those who have accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior by faith are granted God's grace and eternal life. We have faith and hope in the living Word of God and have assurance of salvation, which gives us confidence in God and God's Word. IN addition, purgatory is one of the minor point of the faith, about which John Wesley would caution us to not get into arguments. Arguments would only derail our understanding of each other as brothers and sisters in Christ.

For each one of us, salvation comes by grace through faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, as asserted by the Apostle Paul. Salvation is not dependent on anything that the people around us do, nor what we do, but by faith alone. In response to that faith, we can actively pray for each other, serve each other, and witness to the saving grace of God through Jesus Christ. In THAT is the living Word of God present and active in the world.

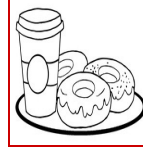

Cream Cheese Cherry Dessert

Low fat graham crackers
8 oz. fat free cream cheese
1 c. cold skim milk
2 Tbsp. lemon juice
1 small package sugar free instant vanilla pudding
8 oz. fat free cool whip, softened
1 can lite cherry pie filling

Line the bottom of a 9x13 pan with graham crackers. Beat the softened cream cheese in a bowl until smooth. Add the milk and lemon juice to the cream cheese and beat until smooth. Stir in the package of pudding until smooth; then fold in the cool whip. Spread half of the cream cheese mixture over the graham crackers. Repeat with another layer of graham crackers, and cream cheese mixture. Spread the pie filling over top. Refrigerate overnight for graham crackers to soften,
