

From Pastor Steve's Desk...

(This is the next installment of an ongoing series of articles regarding what we believe, why we believe it, and why it matters. In the United Methodist Church, there is change coming. Within our global denomination, we have some serious divergent views on the authority of scripture, human sexuality, and what that means in the world and in our church. We aren't sure what the changes will look like, but we know that in order to respond to God's call to be the church in the 21st century, the anchor of our doctrinal identity, we need to know what that is. So, I invite you to join me on this journey for God's glory and to build up the church.)

...on doctrine...

Part 21 - Of the Marriage of Ministers

I'm already smiling as I begin to write this delicious article. I don't get the chance to praise marriage and my wife as much as I'd like. Since John Wesley wrote about the marriage of ministers, I'll take this opportunity to do both, and hopefully encourage everyone (married and single) with the doctrinal standard of marriage in the United Methodist Church.

Here's what Article of Religion 21 says: The ministers of Christ are not commanded by God's law either to vow the estate of single life, or to abstain from marriage; therefore it is lawful for them, as for all other Christians, to marry at their own discretion, as they shall judge the same to serve best to godliness. The Apostle Paul takes a slightly different angle as this when he writes in 1Corinthians 7:1-4; Now for the matters you wrote about: It is good for a man not to marry. But since there is so much immorality, each man should have his own wife, and each woman her own husband. The husband should fulfill his marital duty to his wife, and likewise the wife to her husband. The wife's body does not belong to her alone but also to her husband. In the same way, the husband's body does not belong to him alone but also to his wife.

What Paul is telling us as humans is that it is better to be single in order to devote ones entire life to God and service in the kingdom of God. Yet, because there is so much temptation and propensity for immorality (defined by Paul as any sexual relations outside the bounds of marriage between one man and one woman), one should marry in order to remain within God's plan for humanity.

How does this apply to ministers? Well, ministers are just like every other human being on the planet in that we are subject to temptation. John Wesley knew that, since he himself was a priest in the Anglican Church. He wrote this article in order to contrast the practice of the Roman Catholic Church which forbids its priests to marry, and, in fact, requires them to take a vow of chastity (no sexual relations of any kind). would applaud that, as would we all, in order to focus on God. Unfortunately, we know that the chastity system fails because of sin and temptation. In response, Wesley allowed all his pastors who so chose, to marry and have families.

I'm very thankful for that! You see, Stacy is the most incredible wife, lover, friend, and companion with which I could have been blessed. She consistently supports, encourages, rebukes, and corrects me with a tender heart focused on God's intentions. She is talented, beautiful, praise-worthy, modest, and gifted. I think John Wesley knew that ministers would need spouses to work along them for the good of the kingdom of God.

That goes for all marriages everywhere. The baseline plan for marriage is a man and a woman working together to raise a family and advance the kingdom of God. Some marriages have more elements of that than others, and some are works-in-progress. Those who have chosen to not yet marry, or who are waiting for God's timing can be encouraged by knowing that God wants to use all of us no matter our marital status. If and when you marry, allow God to use all of your marriage for His will. I pray that my marriage is a model for yours and that yours is a model for others. That's a worthy goal for us all.

One more thing...Stacy: I love you and thank God every day because He sent you into my life and allowed me the opportunity to be loved by you. May the love we share be an inspiration to others who hold us in high regard as the pastor and the pastor's spouse. Everything we do, Lord, we do it for You.
