We aren't sure what the changes will look like, but we know that in order to respond to God's call to be the church in the 21st century, the anchor of our doctrinal identity, we need to know what that is. # Part 23 Of the Rulers of the United States of America

The Constitution of the United States of America states that: We, the people of the united States, in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

The founding fathers of our nation were intent to establish a new government, free from the government from which they came:: the monarchy in England. When the people left England to find a new home in the United States, they did not leave their faith behind, but brought a new sense of freedom of religion to America. However, because politics and faith are deeply rooted in the convictions we hold as humans, what happens in politics often has an effect on our expressions of faith. In response, the Methodist Church formalized the recognition of the new government of the United States, separating from the government of England and its authority to influence religion.

Here's what Article of Religion 23 of the Methodist Church says: The President, the Congress, the general assemblies, the governors, and the councils of state, as the delegates of the people, are the rulers of the United States of America, according to the division of power made to them by the Constitution of the United States and by the constitutions of their respective states. And the said states are a sovereign and independent nation, and ought not to be subject to any foreign jurisdiction. (From The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church - 2016. Copyright 2016 by The United Methodist Publishing House)

On the surface, it would appear that this Article was strictly political in nature. However, for the Methodists in America, government control of religion was an experience in England that they did not want to duplicate in America. In addition, because the were "breaking away" from the mother Church of England, they were intent to do things differently in America.

Thus the statement above: that no foreign jurisdiction would have any authority over the government in America OR the church (it is implied).

Now, the constitution of America goes on to establish a division between the church and state. Today, unfortunately, some in our country have wrongly interpreted that as meaning the church should never have contact with anything that is of government. Our founding fathers never intended that faith and religion be expunged from our governments, but that the governments should have no authority in the expressions of faith in the church.

In America, the spirit of freedom that came from our independence from England carried over into our spirit of freedom of religion. We live in a great nation that values freedom for worship, church attendance, service and prayer. Never take that for granted, and always give thanks for your freedoms of religion. Be thankful also for the leaders in the church that were bold enough to know who they were in Christ - which is far more important than who we are as people of a nation.

## Parish Nurse's Monthly Recipe Jody Marsh

## Mexican Cauliflower Rice Skillet Dinner

1 lb. ground beef, chicken or turkey
1/4 medium onion, diced
1/2 red pepper, diced
3 Tbsp taco seasoning
1 c diced tomatoes
12 oz cauliflower rice, fresh or frozen
1/2 c chicken broth
1 1/2 c shredded cheddar or
Mexican Blend cheese

In a large skillet over medium heat, brown ground meat until almost cooked through. Add onion and pepper and continue to cook until no longer pink. Stir in taco seasoning. Add tomatoes and cauliflower rice and stir to combine. Stir in broth and bring to a simmer. Reduce heat to medium low and cook until rice begins to soften, 8-9 minutes for frozen. Sprinkle skillet with cheese and cover. Let cook until cheese is melted, 3-4 minutes. Remove from heat and top with your favorite toppings (sour cream, avocado, black olives, etc.).
