What makes someone extraordinary? For that matter what is extraordinary? The dictionary definitions go something like this:

- 1) Beyond what is ordinary or unusual;
- 2) Highly exceptional; remarkable;
- 3) Employed or used for a special service, function, or occasion

God is making you extraordinary when you agree to do his will in this world, when you agree to be set apart to be employed for God's special service.

Esther was extraordinary because she risked her life to save God's people from total destruction - to set employed for his purposes. David was extraordinary because he aligned himself with God's desire to forgive and build on his legacy for us today - to serve a holy function

People like Abraham, Sarah, Peter, and Mary the Mother of Jesus. Each of these people were ordinary by human standards, but were extraordinary because they allowed God to use them for his holy purposes. You are included in that call to be extraordinary...be set apart for God's purposes.

I pray that you are enjoying the summer as much as possible, amidst the concern over everything that is happening in the world. Take some extra time to relax and find peace in God's creations. My door is always open...

Timing and God

At one time, I was part of a faith-based study group. We were asked when we did our devotions and the majority of the group chose to start their day with prayer and Bible study. When I indicated I chose to do devotions in the late afternoon, it was met with raised eyebrows and shoulder shrugs. I got the message that my timing wasn't appropriate and the leader went on to say that starting our days with God set the tone for the day and put the right words in our minds.

I have always been a morning person - I like to start the day prepared for what lies ahead. In the late afternoon, I would steal a few minutes for myself before finishing up dinner preparations. I read my devotional, prayed for people I heard about or talked to throughout the day, gave thanks and asked forgiveness. During my career, if I stayed at school between the end of the workday and evening meetings, I spent a few minutes with a cup of tea and the Lord. But I often thought back to that study group and wondered if I failed to be a good Christian because I didn't start the day with devotions.

Recently, I read about a lady who remembered, as a young girl, visiting her grandmother on a farm and the busyness of the day until late afternoon when they had everything done and sat down to read scripture and pray before grandpa came in for the evening meal. Her story made me feel better! It isn't when we spend time with God, but that we do spend time with God.

I now have the luxury of doing devotions early morning, mid-day, late afternoon or in the evening - or all of the above! I'm happy with flexible schedules and I think God is good with it, too!

Mac 'N Broc Bake Jody Marsh, Parish Nurse

4 1/2 oz (1 1/4 c) uncooked whole grain elbow macaroni

4 c broccoli florets 6 c roughly chopped cauliflower

2 tsp chopped garlic 3/4 tsp salt 1/2 tsp black pepper 3/4 c fat free milk

1/3 c plus 2 Tbsp grated Parmesan cheese 1/4 c whole wheat Panko breadcrumbs

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Spray an 8x8 inch baking pan with nonstick spray.
- 2. Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add pasta and broccoli. Cook both according to the instructions on the pasta package, about 8 minutes.
- 3. Meanwhile, place cauliflower in a large microwave safe bowl. Add 1/3 c water. Cover and microwave for 8 minutes, or until soft.
- 4. Transfer pasta and broccoli to a strainer to drain. Place in a large bowl.
- 5. To make the sauce, in a blender or food processor, combine cooked cauliflower, garlic, salt, and pepper. Add milk, 1/3 c cheese and 1/4 c water. Blend on high speed until smooth and uniform.
- 6. Add sauce to the large bowl, and stir to coat. Transfer to the baking pan and smooth out the top.
- 7. Sprinkle with breadcrumbs and remaining 2 Tbsp of cheese, and bake until top is golden brown and entire dish is hot and bubbly, 15-20 minutes.
- 8. Let cool for 10 minutes before serving.

1/8th of Pan: 192 calories; 4g fat; 548g sodium; 29.5g carbs; 6g fiber; 6g sugar; 12.5g protein
