

From Pastor Steve's Desk... New Creation

God's word says in 2 Corinthians 5:17, "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!"

This is our hope for salvation and our hope for another new year. If we consider the magnitude of the lesson in this verse (a verse we may have glossed over in the past), we may quickly realize the life-changing message contained herein. Interestingly, if we begin with a look at the original text, (in Greek), we see that the idea here is not that we are simply changed into something else when we accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. It's much more than that. Paul is telling us here that if we allow Christ into our lives, from that point on, there is new creation. The original text reads more like this: "So if anyone is in Christ, NEW CREATION!" Christ begins in us a new creation and continues to mold us as we repent, grow, learn, and change into God's plan for us.

2020 is over and we can begin to look with hope to 2021. For the church, what might being made new look like? Well, in many ways, it's all ready occurred and it is continuing to occur. We've had to do just about everything in ministry in different ways. For some people, different almost always means harder or worse. But as a pastor, different often leads to new ways of doing ministry that are more fruitful, more spiritual, and even more fun! How we enter into worship, how we gather in groups, and the value of community have all been upended or brought to the forefront of our attention. The Church in North America needed a wake-up call and through our willingness to keep adapting and growing through this pandemic, we've said to the forces of evil that want nothing more than to tear God's work apart that we are standing on the promises of Jesus and being led by the Spirit to the provision and vision of God. Take THAT, Satan!

So, what can you do? Well, first, let's get back into our prayer closets and into our prayer chairs and open ourselves to the vision that God has for our mission. Our Growth and Vision Team is just about ready to wrap up our discussions about our mission and vision. Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. That mission gets lived out right here in our community by lovingly providing every person in our community the opportunity to believe in and follow Jesus. We continue to strive to be a church in, for, and with the community. Our CenterPoint project is a tool that is and will reach out to our entire region in the name of Jesus. This year, it's time to keep building our vision and allowing the Spirit to grow us.

I'm not one for resolutions, but I resolve to keep learning how to lead this congregation to all that God has in store for us. I resolve to be faithful in giving, teaching, preaching, and leading our teams to maximum capacity and fruitfulness. With your participation and prayer, we can share the Good News, love our neighbors, and transform the world together. Happy New Year!
