

From Pastor Steve's Desk...

This is the next installment of an ongoing series of articles regarding what we believe, why we believe it, and why it matters. In the United Methodist Church, there is change coming. Within our global denomination, we have some serious divergent views on the authority of scripture, human sexuality, and what that means in the world and in our church. We aren't sure what the changes will look like, but we know that in order to respond to God's call to be the church in the 21st century, the anchor of our doctrinal identity, we need to know what that is. So, I invite you to join me on the journey for God's glory and to build up the church.

...on doctrine... Part 6 - Of the Old Testament

We find ourselves at an interesting part of the doctrinal confession of the United Methodist Church - what about the Old Testament? You've heard it said that the Old Testament is, well, *old*, and doesn't pertain to Christians. Maybe you've heard it said that the Old Testament is replaced by the New Testament or that somehow, it's in conflict with it.

Well, this article will hopefully clear up any confusion regarding what we believe. This is important because of the primacy of scripture for the life of the Christian church, including the Old and New Testaments, as we learned last month. Here's what the United Methodist *Articles of Religion* has to say:

The Old Testament is not contrary to the New; for both in the Old and New Testament everlasting life is offered to mankind by Christ, who is the only Mediator between God and man, being both God and Man. Wherefore they are not to be heard who feign that the old fathers did look only for transitory promises. Although the law given from God by Moses as touching ceremonies and rites doth not bind Christians, nor ought the civil precepts thereof of necessity be received in any commonwealth; yet notwithstanding, no Christian whatsoever is free from the obedience of the commandments which are called moral.

Now, there are some pretty foreign words in the *Article*, yet the point is: we are as bound by God's intent for the world as presented in the Old Testament, as we are bound by the Gospel, the letters of Paul, and the books of the New Testament. In particular, we are bound by God's commandments contained in Exodus 20, *The Ten Commandments*. If you haven't read those in a while, or reviewed them in your mind and heart, today's the day. The mighty acts of God told in the Old Testament, His continuous rescue of His people, God's mercy and forgiveness, the provision and leadership - all these things are facts of our lives as well.

The difference between the Old and New Testaments is the fact that we have the living, guiding, redeeming Jesus Christ in the flesh to once and for all satisfy the relationship between God and His people for those who choose it. Jesus was a man of the Old Testament! He said that he did not come to abolish the Law (the parts of the Old Testament pertaining to the rules and religion), but to COMPLETE the Law for all time. We are living into the completion of the Law of God to the people of Israel when we accept Jesus as Savior, live by (continued on next page)

God's moral law in the Ten Commandments, and learn and grow into disciples by knowing both the Old and New Testaments.

My prayer is that we will see the whole of scripture as the inspired and directive Word of God and that it may be life for us. In addition, we must be obedient to the God who wrote it, no matter how the culture around us may want us to change it. May God pour out complete and fulfilling blessings on us as we embrace the whole of scripture for the transformation of the world!

One Pan No Peek Chicken and Rice

From Parish Nurse Jody

5 boneless, skinless chicken breasts

2 boxes Zatarans long grain & wild rice mix

1 can cream of celery soup

1 can cream of mushroom soup

1/4 tsp. garlic powder

1 1/4 soup can of water

1 box Lipton onion soup mix (2 packets)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine all ingredients except the chicken in a 9x13 baking pan. Mix well.

Place chicken evenly on top of rice mixture. Sprinkle with onion soup mix. Cover tightly with aluminum foil and bake 1 hour and 45 minutes. Remove from oven and let rest for 5 minutes.

NOTE: Don't open the oven to peek at the chicken and for sure, don't remove the foil!!
