

From Pastor Steve's Desk...

(This is the next installment of an ongoing series of articles regarding what we believe, why we believe it, and why it matters. In the United Methodist Church, there is change coming. Within our global denomination, we have some serious divergent views on the authority of scripture, human sexuality, and what that means in the world and in our church. We aren't sure what the changes will look like, but we know that in order to respond to God's call to be the church in the 21st century, the anchor of our doctrinal identity, we need to know what that is. So, I invite you to join me on this journey for God's glory and to build up the church.)

...on doctrine...

Part 7 - Of Original or Birth Sin

Welcome to the next stage of our look into the doctrine of the United Methodist Church. This month, we will find our about original sin and the role sin plays in the life of the church. Now, many of us are familiar with sin. In fact, I'm going to stick my neck out and say that we ALL are very aware of sin - ours, yours, mine, his, hers and theirs. But from where did all this sin come and how do we deal with sin in our lives and in the world? The answer lies with God and God's plan for the world.

When God created, everything was as it was supposed to be - perfect, eternal, sinless, and all to the glory of God, the Creator. We read in Genesis 3, however, that at some point after God created man and woman, there was an incident that led to the Fall of Man...and sin entered the world. Now, hear me when I say that all the sin of the world is *NOT* the fault of Adam and Eve, but is simply a continued failure to acknowledge that God is God and we humans are not. Eve was tempted to want ot know what God knows - to be in control. We are as well.

Here's what Article of Religion 7 says about this: Original sin stands not in the following of Adam, but it is the corruption of the nature of every man, that naturally is engendered of the offspring of Adam, whereby man is very far gone from original righteousness, and of his own nature inclined to evil, and that continually.

The key points here are that we are decedents of the original man and woman, as created by God, have continued the path away from original right standing with God, and will be inclined to sin more in the future. Now, that's depressing! Yet, there is hope!

When we are born, God creates life from life at conception. That small child, although not sinful in action or thought, has all the potential from then on to be sinful, following the pattern of all humans. God does not hold that child accountable for the sin in his/her life at the point, but nurtures the child by grace and calls the child to Himself over time. Incidentally, our Wesleyan heritage affirms that before a child reaches an age of being able to understand the consequence of sin and the need for a Savior, God is grace-filled and merciful. After a child can understand sin and judgment, the child must choose Christ as Lord and Savior or be accountable for the sin in his/her life. All this, because sin came into the world so long ago.

And there's been some confusion in the United Methodist Church regarding what constitutes sin and what does not. Well, that's been a question that has been debated for a very long time. A simplistic answer to that question is that anything that rejects God's good plan for our lives is sin. Sin invades many areas of our lives and all sin is on an equal footing. Different sins have different consequences, but sin is sin. Whether it's a breakdown of relationships, sexual sin, greed, pride, lust, or any other category, sin separates us from God. We don't get to define it to meet our needs. We have the opportunity to allow God to transform us away from it through repentance and forgiveness. That's where the Hope comes in.

The Hope, my friends, comes from God's plan of salvation in Jesus Christ! The sin that invades our lives both by our choices and the choices of others, can *only* be washed away by the blood that Jesus shed on the cross. It was the only way that God could allow us to be reconciled because of the sin in our lives. God and sin can never exist together. Because God's plan is for us to live eternally, our sin is nailed to the cross of Jesus as we face judgment before God for our sin.

The first humans may have set the stage for sin and wickedness, but we have followed right along. We give glory and praise to God for loving us so completely that a sacrifice of God's only Son, Jesus, was the way God chose to be with us forever.

Recipe from Jody Marsh, Parish Nurse

Taco Soup (Low carb and Keto friendly)

- 1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breast
- 1 onion, diced
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 14.5 oz. can pinto beans, drained
- 14.5 oz. can black beans, drained
- 14.5 oz. canned corn, drained
- 14.5 oz. can diced tomatoes w/ green chiles, not drained; plain, canned tomatoes, if preferred
- 2 c. fat free chicken broth
- 1.25 oz. taco seasoning

Add everything to slow cooker. Cook on low for 4 hours (up to 5 is fine).

Remove the chicken and shred or chop and then place back in the crock pot to serve.
