

From Pastor Steve's Desk...

Dead doesn't mean dead....

Are you ready? Are you prepared? I've asked that question quite a few times lately from the pulpit and in small groups. It's Lent and we are fast approaching the glory and wonder of Easter morning. Let's be ready!

This month, as we continue to sit at the table of Jesus for his last meal with his disciples, what He knows (that we don't) is that he's going to die. He'll be beaten and murdered, put in the grave, go to hell and back, and then do something that has transformed the world. Jesus will be raised from the dead...when dead wasn't really dead for good!

In the Apostles Creed, we read this statement of faith: On the third day he rose again. The resurrection account of Jesus is recorded in the Gospels from the eyewitnesses to the event. Various men and women witnessed the empty tomb, the missing guards, angel, and the linens that had been wrapped around Jesus' body. More importantly, they witnessed the risen Christ himself, talking and standing with them. This truth claim is essential to the Christian faith and central to the validity of Jesus' words, which claimed that he would rise after three days. It also represents victory over Satan, fuels our hope in God's promises, and provides a tangible idea of our coming destiny.

Three days after Jesus had been placed in the tomb, he was risen from the dead and took on a glorified human body. The act of rising from the dead is not something that Jesus himself accomplished, but he "was raised" from the dead by the diving power of the Triune God. The disciples and those that were with Jesus had not completely understood the breadth of his role in God's plan. The resurrection was the new beginning that convinced the disciples that Jesus truly was the Messiah, that he triumphed over death, and was divine. This added validity, also then, to the other claims of Jesus, his description of the kingdom of God, and his commandments and his commandments and teachings.

Jesus appeared to the men and women that he encountered just after the resurrection and was in a glorified human body.; Resurrection is not simply a matter, for Jesus, of returning of the completely divine nature from whence he existed prior to the incarnation. Following the incarnation and his life and death, Jesus is resurrected into a renewed body.

The effect of this truth claim is that just as Jesus was raised from the dead, we, too, will be raised from the dead. Just as Jesus lives in heaven as a human and divine being, we, too, will live as glorified humans in heaven.

The ultimate focus on Easter is our hope for the future, when we will come into our own glorified bodies, bowing before our Lord and Savior, placing at his feet all that we have stored up in heaven! Eternally praising him, worshipping him, and basking in his love. May it be soon!

Holy Week is coming...be prepared!

Recipe for the month of March Jody Marsh, Parish Nurse

TURKEY MUSHROOM SURPRISE!!

1 1/4 pounds raw lean ground turkey
5 c sliced mushrooms
1 onion, thinly sliced
One 12 oz jar fat free turkey gravy
1 Tbsp dry onion soup mix
1 Tbsp cornstarch

Add all ingredients except onion soup mix and cornstarch to the crockpot. Mix well, breaking up the ground turkey as you mix. Cover and cook on high for 3-4 hours; OR cook on low for 7-8 hours. Reduce heat to lowest setting. Sprinkle onion soup mix and cornstarch into the crockpot and stir until dissolved. Allow to sit uncovered 5 minutes. Serve over your favorite pasta.
