

From Pastor Steve's Desk...

### From the Cross...into eternity.

Starting sometime in January, pastors and worship leaders begin to think about Lent and Easter. This isn't so unique, this planning ahead, since there are others that do the same thing... greenhouse owners, chocolate makers, and those who are planning a much needed vacation. All of these people take time to plan for the season of Easter by breaking the ordinary routine and planning for the extraordinary.

Ironically, the observations we note from the cross of Jesus project the most extraordinary events into the most common setting. And we're left with an amazing display of God's love and

compassion for us.

"The theological power of the [Cross] derives not from how Christ's crucifixion differs from all other crucifixions but from its essential similarity. ... Christ died in precisely the same way that so many other thousands of God's children had already died and would die in the future - many because of their loyalty to him. ... As he was given to us by means of the most common of births, he was taken from us by the most common of deaths." (*Don C. Skinner*, A Passage Through Sacred History.)

In the midst of our extraordinary planning and implementation for Lent and Easter, we gear up to celebrate the life and death of Jesus Christ. We remember Jesus' birth just a few short months ago. We've relived some awesome moments of Jesus' life while in worship and bible study. We've seen Jesus happy, and angry, and sad - all the emotions that we, too, experience.

And so finally, now, in April, we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus. Funny that we should celebrate his death along with resurrection...no runny, ha ha, but funny, curious. This sad murder takes a prominent place in the life of the church and our beliefs. All the theological thought of the Apostle Paul is merely philosophy without the truth of the death of Jesus. And so Jesus' death on Good Friday takes its rightful place a few days before the resurrection of Easter. And we worship on both of those days. We worship and celebrate for the goodness that God provides in life, death, and resurrection in Jesus.

Are you willing to celebrate the death of Jesus...of God's divine-human son who was destined to die for your sin? Or do you want to skip right to Easter so the greenhouses and the chocolate maker's plans can be the ones we celebrate? Many in our world choose the latter, and miss the whole point.

Easter is the glorious climax of Jesus ministry on earth. Easter is the glorious beginning for us to celebrate and glorify our Lord and Savior. But it's just the beginning! Pentecost is coming! The Holy Spirit is at work! May the ordinary turn extraordinary for all of us this Easter season!



# "Courageous Conversations"

Last spring, Church Council had to cancel an event called "Courageous Conversations" with Pastor Carmen Perry, Lay Leader Susan Hardy and Pastor Steve. This spring we will host that conversation with Pastor Perry and Susan Hardy at PUMC to talk about the conflicts within the United Methodist Church related to the responsibilities of pastors to follow the Book of Discipline and the desire of those in the LGBTQ community to be loved, accepted, and married within their churches.

Last year, Pastor Steve wrote a series of articles for the Grace Notes related to this issue and the doctrine of the United Methodist Church. If you want to reread these articles, we will have a few printed copies available and you can access the pdf online. This may provide good background information prior to our "Courageous Conversations".

"Courageous Conversations" will be held at the church with limited guests and a ZOOM like to allow anyone interested to participate at home. The even will be held on Thursday, April 22 at 7pm. Please call the church office closer to the date for a ZOOM link. It will also be posted on announcements at church.

### The Meal Preparation Committee

The Meal Preparation Committee is a service of the Food Security Team. Charged with providing meals to those recovering from a serious illness, surgery, injury or any need where a meal will help in the time of stress and medical decisions.

Anyone who knows of a family who will benefit from the receipt of a meal will refer the family to Pastor Steve or Jody Marsh, the Parish Nurse. When the Pastor or Parish Nurse is made aware of needs, they will refer the family to the Meal Preparation Committee. The Pastor and Nurse will confirm with the family that a meal will be accepted and will include any information regarding the number of people in the family and any food sensitivities. The referral will then be forwarded to the Meal Preparation Committee chairman.

The Meal Preparation Committee will:

- 1. Solicit and maintain a list of people who are will to prepare and deliver meals.
- 2 Accept referrals from the Pastor or Church Nurse
- 3. Determine who will contact individuals to prepare/deliver the meal when needed,
- 4. Provide the person delivering the meal with contact information so they can arrange a convenient delivery time.
- 5. Promote ministry through Grace Notes and the church bulletin.


