Annotation of a Creed

Starting this month, I will be sharing a series of articles with you regarding our beliefs as a church. In seminary, I had to articulate and annotate the Apostles' Creed. I thought it would be helpful to share that reflection with you and add some commentary where necessary. Some of the language I use is more scholarly than you are used to (or that I am typically used to), but read on.

The first article is entitled God the Father.

The first line of the Apostles' Creed (AC) is: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Belief in the doctrinal truth claims of the AC can be experienced at two different levels. One can understand all the tenets of the Christian faith and express that faith through that knowledge and information. That is referred to as "The Faith" by John Lawson in his book, *Introduction to Christian Theology*. "The Faith" is an important corporate learning process that passes the Christian faith from generation to generation. Another level is one in which the truth claims of the AC confront each person, individually, in such a way that he/she is convinced of and expresses that truth in a heartfelt faith that leads to a life lived to serve and be loved by God. God reveals truth to us through the special work of the Hole Spirit and also through our general perception of God through nature and our human faculties.

There are several arguments that have been formulated to prove the existence of God. Among them are the ontological (the existence of God has been weaved into our minds by God), the cosmological (the universe is proof of God), the teleological (the apparent purpose and order of the universe proves that God exists) and the moral (because there is assumed to be a good heart in each person, God must be the source of that goodness). Each argument illuminates a portion of the mystery of God's existence, but the existence and purpose of God is beyond our comprehension, and faith is the bridge that connects us to God.

That faith connection has led our understanding of the natures of God. God is transcendent and completely holy, which means God has sovereign control over the universe (heaven and earth) that God alone has made. Because God is holy, God can not tolerate sin. God is also an imminent God, ever-present and intimate. God knows us by heart, and desires that our hearts turn to Him alone in faith. God desires us to be in a relationship with Him.

Belief in God, **the Father Almighty**, is the first truth statement that is made in the AC. The reference to God as Father is normative for Christians because it is indicative of God's natures: provider, protector, and superior to God's children. The male-gendered association for the first person of the Trinity is used to express the personhood of the Father. The Father loves and speaks and cares for creation, thus exhibiting that nature. We do know, however, that God is not male or female, but engenders both male and female and we interact with God with characteristics that are both male and female in nature.

The term Almighty is used to express the eternal, omnipotent, and all powerful aspect of the Fatherly nature of love. Out of that love, we believe that God created the heavens, the universe,

the earth, the animals and plants, and the sky and the sea. Out of God's love, God created humans, in God's image, as expressions of perfect will

Why is this important to know? Well, what we believe is critical to knowing in WHOM we believe. This series of articles will help us dive deeper into our faith.

Next month... I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

The Meal Preparation Committee

The Meal Preparation Committee is a service of the Food Security Team. Charged with providing meals to those recovering from a serious illness, surgery, injury or any need where a meal will help in the time of stress and medical decisions.

Anyone who knows of a family who will benefit from the receipt of a meal will refer the family to Pastor Steve or Jody Marsh, the Parish Nurse. When the Pastor or Parish Nurse is made aware of needs, they will refer the family to the Meal Preparation Committee. The Pastor and Nurse will confirm with the family that a meal will be accepted and will include any information regarding the number of people in the family and any food sensitivities. The referral will then be forwarded to the Meal Preparation Committee chairman.

The Meal Preparation Committee will:

- 1. Solicit and maintain a list of people who are will to prepare and deliver meals.
- 2 Accept referrals from the Pastor or Church Nurse
- 3. Determine who will contact individuals to prepare/deliver the meal when needed,
- 4. Provide the person delivering the meal with contact information so they can arrange a convenient delivery time.
- 5. Promote ministry through Grace Notes and the church bulletin.
