From Pastor Steve's Desk...

Annotation of a Creed The Incarnation of Jesus Christ

(This is part of a continuing series about the truth claims of the Apostles' Creed [ACJ])

Last month, we looked at our understanding of Jesus the Son of God. This month, we look at the third statement in the Apostles' Creed: [Jesus] who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary...

The ultimate divine interaction of God with humans came in the form of the Son, Jesus Christ. This was accomplished through the mysterious work of the Holy Spirit, who so filled a human female, that she became pregnant with the intercourse of a man. This truth claim affirms that Jesus was born as an infant to a human mother named Mary, who was preparing to marry a man named Joseph. Mary and Joseph had not yet consummated their marriage, and so she was a virgin. The fact that she was a virgin is important to Christian theology because without it, Jesus' divine nature may be questioned.

John 1:14 says; "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory,

the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.'

God's plan was for Jesus to come to earth, to live among us, to show us his nature and examples, to teach and guide, to reveal God's final plan of salvation, to inform us of the Holy Spirit, and to die on the cross to redeem all God's children's sin. The incarnation of Jesus is about God showing undying love for us by sending a Savior as a liaison between us and God through the leading of the Holy Spirit.

In response to God's love and desire to be in relationship with us, God sent Jesus Christ into the world as an infant, putting a plan into motion. God took on human nature, becoming fully human, yet staying fully God. Jesus Christ was both divine and human, existing with us, as one of us. As a human, Jesus would have all he frailties and temptations as we do, but because he was divine and followed perfectly the will of God the Father, he was without sin.

Jesus Christ became one of us. He did not become *like* a human for our sake, he *became* human for our sake. At the same time, he remained fully divine. This mystery may be one of the hardest things for us to understand, but think of a campfire. Each piece of fire is still fire anywhere in the campfire. A piece may be separated from the campfire, but it is still fire, yet with a different nature than the campfire. Jesus willingly broke away from the campfire to become human, retaining the qualities of the campfire (God) at the same time.

Don't forget to be in awe of the fact that Jesus Christ would humble himself for YOU(!) - for your sin, for God's glory, and for the love that we share as a church, a family, and a community. In addition, God's act of grace through Jesus Christ calls you to respond. The church can pray for you, serve you, and uplift you, but your response to the incarnation of Jesus Christ must be more than taking from the church - it must be **action**. Serve in a ministry this year - it's the path to glorifying God for Jesus Christ.

The Meal Preparation Committee

The Meal Preparation Committee is a service of the Food Security Team. Charged with providing meals to those recovering from a serious illness, surgery, injury or any need where a meal will help in the time of stress and medical decisions.

Anyone who knows of a family who will benefit from the receipt of a meal will refer the family to Pastor Steve or Jody Marsh, the Parish Nurse. When the Pastor or Parish Nurse is made aware of needs, they will refer the family to the Meal Preparation Committee. The Pastor and Nurse will confirm with the family that a meal will be accepted and will include any information regarding the number of people in the family and any food sensitivities. The referral will then be forwarded to the Meal Preparation Committee chairman.

The Meal Preparation Committee will:

- 1. Solicit and maintain a list of people who are will to prepare and deliver meals.
- 2 Accept referrals from the Pastor or Church Nurse.
- Determine who will contact individuals to prepare/deliver the meal when needed.
- 4. Provide the person delivering the meal with contact information so they can arrange a convenient delivery time.
- 5. Promote ministry through Grace Notes and the church bulletin.


Welcome to the PUMC Family...

My Longhouse Submitted by Carol Hay

Over the years, I've had classes where we studied how the brain works, I've listened to lectures at Chautauqua Institution and podcasts from NPR and I've read articles about the brain.

At one point, I was interested in a concept called compartmentalization. The theory was you can put separate problems or experiences into compartments in your brain so you deal with one thing at a time while other issues reside in their own compartments waiting for their time to be considered. I even remember someone commenting to me that I must be able to compartmentalize well as I dealt with work issues while family members were involved in a natural disaster.

I have no training in the science of the brain. I do have life experiences and recently decided compartmentalization doesn't happen, or maybe, shouldn't happen. People, events, words, actions - all come into our lives and blend together to make us who we are and determine our reaction in a given situation.

Remember studying native cultures and learning about longhouses - where families live in one big room? I'm thinking our brains are longhouses. We bring people and experiences into our longhouse and the mix is why we make the decisions we make, do the things we do, and believe the way we choose to believe. We don't make a decision in isolation, but we use what we've learned and experienced to inform our choices.

What we need to be careful of is who and what we allow into our "longhouse". Allowing toxic people in our lives may poison other relationships. Listening to music that degrades women allows those words into our longhouse. Watching inappropriate or violent videos puts those images into a longhouse without compartments. Negative influences can impact the people around us and the decisions we make in all areas of our lives.

Filling our longhouse with the teachings from the Bible, positive role models and music with messages of God's love can only help us make good decisions. As people and experiences accumulate in our longhouses, they mix together, giving us a blend that shapes our thoughts and directs our actions. We remember what we love, focus on the positive and move forward knowing that our longhouse holds valuable support for living a good life.

Compartments are great for sorting nuts, bolts, nails, washers, and for fabric storage. But I think our brains are longhouses with people, experiences and knowledge co-existing to provide the way to make good decisions while storing wonderful memories.
