From Pastor Steve's Desk...

Victory in Jesus

(This is part of a continuing series about the truth claims of the Apostles' Creed [AC])

There's victory in Jesus! I say "Amen(!) to that! And I pray that you do as well. There is victory in the Son of God and his presence with us. But what does that really mean? What are we to understand as Christians that would cause us to proclaim that there is *victory in Jesus*? Victory over what or whom?

As we continue spending some time looking more deeply to the claims made by the Apostle's Creed (AC), we might begin to see a glimmer of what God defeated through Jesus.

Last month, we talked about the death and burial of Jesus as the fulfillment of a wonderfully mysterious plan to pull you and me out of the pit that we find ourselves in most of the time. It's a plan to rescue us from sin...a plan of salvation.

My question for us this month is: why should we care about being in the pit? What's at the end of the road? Well, the answer to that is death - and I'm not talking just any death, but eternal death and darkness and separation from God forever.

Now that we know the boundaries, let's look at the next part of the AC, which talks about Jesus going to be with the dead for a time.

...he descended to the dead...

This clause of the AC was included in the earliest forms of the creed, and seemingly was an important theological issue. The time between the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is a mystery, but this truth claim asserts that Jesus was present with the people that had previously died. Two paradigms exist as to the idea of this state of being, whether a place or a condition.

The importance of this clause is found in the victory that Jesus gained over the grave, for all people, for all time. Jesus' earthly existence ended when he died, but that was the beginning of the accomplishment of the greater purpose that Jesus came to fulfill. Because Jesus overcame death and hell, we, too, have the promise that we will overcome death if Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior.

The pit that I mentioned earlier is someplace from which Jesus has rescued you if you put your faith (maybe as big as a mustard seed) in him. You need not worry about eternal death or eternal separation from God - it's all been made right for you. But therein lies the rub. Is it that way for all people universally? Or do some reject the attempts by the God of all creation to restore a relationship with him? Sadly the answer is Yes...many will be sad on the day of judgement.

But that's not God's plan. God wants all to be with him forevermore. God wants all to see heaven and sing praises to him.

Maybe it's time for you to take a break from your normal routine and make that phone call to someone who's hurting. Maybe it's time to give up one thing that you're DOING, and spend time in prayer for someone who is spiritually lost. Take the first step, and God will multiply anything you do.

The victory has already been won...now we just have to tell everyone else about it!

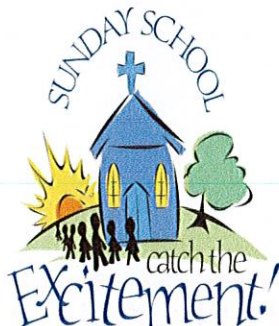

Sunday School for ALL ages!

Have you been thinking of joining a Sunday School class or looking for one for your children? We have classes for all ages, from age 3 to adult. Most classes meet on Sunday mornings from 9 - 10am. It is never too late to start. Our classes meet you, where you are in your walk with God. If you would like to find out more or are willing to start a new class, please call the church office.

PreK - 2nd grade: Summer and Kevin Wolcott. They are using David C. Cook curriculum (Bible In Life). Children learn songs, listen to a Bible story and complete an activity each week.

Grades 3-5: Howie Wheeler. Howie prepares lessons based off of what Pastor Steve will be preaching about that particular Sunday. This helps the kids understand what is happening during worship and they are able to get more out of the sermons.

Grades 6-8: Becky Cable. She is using the ABC Curriculum. The class focuses on why they can trust the scriptures. Students will learn to stand on God's word rather than man's word.

Grades 9-12: Jess Nelson. The David C. Cook curriculum (Bible in Life) is being used in this grade level. Students will connect everyday situations to God's Word and be able to apply God's word to their everyday lives.

HUGS (Helping Us Grow Strong) Adult Class: George Anderson. This class is using the book, The Parables Jesus Taught. Through this study they will gain new understanding about the parables Jesus taught and be able to apply it to their daily life.

Adult Class: Jon Cable. Answers Bible Curriculum. This class will learn why the Bible is to be the ultimate authority by learning about the overall themes of the Bible using the 7 C's: Creation, Corruption, Catastrophes, Confusion, Christ, Cross and Consummation.

Women's Class: Marge Vollmer. Currently they are discussing Satan and how to keep him from controlling our lives.

Classes that meet at times other than Sunday Mornings: Adult Class: Stacy Taylor. This class meets on Tuesdays at 3:30 in the Gallery. This class spends time talking a closer look at scripture.

Adult Class: Cindy and Dennis Furlow. This class will be meeting at church. There will be a Zoom option, should you desire that.

Parish Nurse Recipe of the Month

APPLE CRISP

(Jody Marsh)

6 medium apples (honey crisp or gala), peeled and sliced
1/4 inch thick)

1.5 oz raisins (small box)

3/4 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp fresh lemon juice

1 Tbsp cornstarch

1/4 tsp honey

1 c quick oats

3 Tbsp light brown sugar (not packed)

1 tsp cinnamon

2 1/2 Tbsp butter, melted

1. Heat oven to 350 degrees
2. Combine apples, cinnamon, raisins, lemon juice and
Honey in large bowl.
3. Sprinkle with cornstarch. Toss until fruit is coated.
4. Place fruit in ungreased baking dish. Cover with foil
and place in oven for 15 min. Remove from oven
5. Mix the remaining topping ingredients and sprinkle
over fruit.
6. Bake about 60 minutes or until topping is golden
brown and fruit is tender.

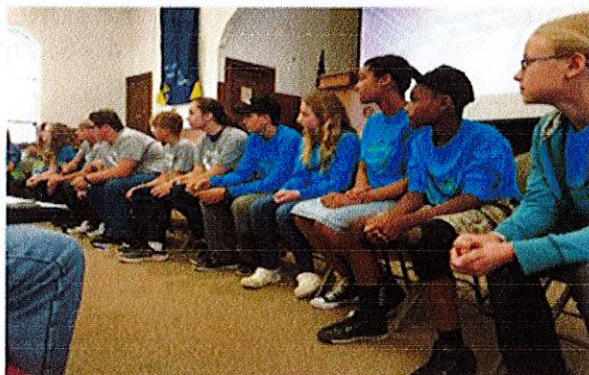
Bible Quizzing!

Overlooking Insults Carol Hay, contributor

I recently had the privilege of attending a series of lectures over a period of five days that relate to the American Foreign Service. Speakers were senior foreign service employees and employees of the State Department. The knowledge they shared on diplomacy, foreign policy, and specific countries was insightful, interesting, and thought-provoking.

After several lectures, I was hearing one theme over and over. We cannot make progress in setting good policy, negotiation treaties, or ending wars unless we understand the history and the culture of the country. We must build relationships with individuals and countries in order to talk with and understand each other. It seems knowing why someone says or does something is just as important in working with countries as it is in dealing with individuals.

Proverbs 12:16 says "A fool shows his annoyance at once, but a prudent man overlooks an insult." That is where I want to be - able to overlook an insult, a hurt, a slight, a caustic word. It is so easy to be kind and caring with those who treat us well, give us compliments, and act as we do. Building a relationship with someone who is very different from us - who may say something we regard as unkind or who negatively responds to our friendly overtures - is very difficult. If we struggle on a personal basis with small differences or slights, imagine how hard it is to meet resistance in a very different culture with history we don't know or cannot understand. Finding common ground to build those relationships is such a great .

God made each of us and he made us different - He also told us to love one another. He never said it would be easy. When I give someone a pass on rude behavior and instead find common ground, we can start to build a relationship. Overlooking perceived or real insults can result in understanding his/her needs, developing a better working relationship, and even finding a new friend.

I've never had to negotiate with people who spoke a different language, valued dissimilar things and based their culture on a history thousands of years old. I leave those challenges to others. I do have opportunities on a daily basis to overlook slights and insults and sow love to others. I can build relationships and make connections that will result in building a better, more caring community. As each of us does this, our world becomes a better place.
