From Pastor Steve's Desk...

The Broken Body (This is part of a continuing series about the truth claims of the Apostles' Creed [ACJ])

Last month, we looked at our understanding of the fourth statement in the Apostles' Creed: [Jesus] who suffered under Pontius Pilate...

This month, we will look at the outcome of that suffering. [Jesus] was crucified, died and was buried...

This truth claim is taken from the Gospel accounts of the final days of Jesus' life on earth. The suffering that Jesus endured to initiate the redemptive work of the cross was completed when Jesus died a violent and painful death. Following that certain death, Jesus' body was buried in a tomb and sealed.

This torture, death, and burial were necessitated by the presence of sin in the world, from fallen humanity - sin that separates us from God. Sin entered the world through the fall of humanity by Adam and Eve. It is a mystery why God allowed sin to enter the world, but because of God's desire to allow creation to have free will, sin is a consequence of our imperfect, prideful, doubtful nature. We do know that sin and evil are realities with which we must struggle as we live our lives.

Because God can not be in the presence of sin due to God's holy nature, our sin is unacceptable to God. We, as humans, however, are powerless to make an atoning sacrifice to God for that sin. For that atonement, we depend on Jesus Christ. The several theories of atonement which are offered to clarify the work of Christ on the cross are the ransom theory (Jesus is the ransom to Satan for sinners), substitution (Jesus' death is sufficient sacrifice for our sin), substitution (Jesus bore the punishment for our sin), and the moral influence theory (the crucifixion persuades sinner to repent). Each of these theories holds a portion of the power of the claim that Jesus died to atone for our sins, and to pave the way for us to be 'at-one' with God.

The explicit claim that Jesus died and was buried is also partially in response to critics that would assert that Jesus was not really dead, or that he was not buried in a sealed tomb. The reason this criticism needed to be refuted was that Jesus' enemies were attempting to discredit the claims made by the eyewitnesses to the events in order to extinguish the movement. Jesus did die and was buried, for it was the job of the Roman soldier to ensure that Jesus was dead. And they were VERY good at their jobs.

Jesus' suffering and death are the culmination of a plan that God had for us. A plan that began with the wonderfully quiet birth of a Messiah baby boy, and ended with the death of the human body of Jesus. In between, God shows his love for you by giving you the gift of salvation in Christ.

Believe in Him, won't you? He was broken and died for YOU...and that's what I call LOVE.

The Meal Preparation Committee

The Meal Preparation Committee is a service of the Food Security Team. Charged with providing meals to those recovering from a serious illness, surgery, injury or any need where a meal will help in the time of stress and medical decisions.

Anyone who knows of a family who will benefit from the receipt of a meal will refer the family to Pastor Steve or Jody Marsh, the Parish Nurse. When the Pastor or Parish Nurse is made aware of needs, they will refer the family to the Meal Preparation Committee. The Pastor and Nurse will confirm with the family that a meal will be accepted and will include any information regarding the number of people in the family and any food sensitivities. The referral will then be forwarded to the Meal Preparation Committee chairman.

The Meal Preparation Committee will:

- 1. Solicit and maintain a list of people who are will to prepare and deliver meals.
- 2 Accept referrals from the Pastor or Church Nurse.
- 3. Determine who will contact individuals to prepare/deliver the meal when needed,
- 4. Provide the person delivering the meal with contact information so they can arrange a convenient delivery time.
- 5. Promote ministry through Grace Notes and the church bulletin.


