From Pastor Steve's Desk...

Dead doesn't mean dead... (this is part of a continuing series about the truth claims of the Apostles' Creed [AC])

Are you ready? Are you prepared? I've asked that question quite a few times lately from the pulpit and in small groups. It's November and we are fast approaching the glory and wonder of Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. Let's be ready!

This month, as we continue to take a closer look at the truth claims in the Apostle's Creed, we get to the climax of the journey, as far as our earthly Jesus goes. He's been beaten and murdered, put in the grave, been to hell and back, and now he does something that has transformed the world. Jesus is raised from the dead...when dead wasn't really dead for good!

On the third day he rose again

The resurrection account of Jesus is recorded in the Gospels from the eye-witnesses to the event. Various men and women witnessed the empty tomb, the missing guards, angels, and the linens that had been wrapped around Jesus' body. More importantly, they witnessed the risen Christ himself, talking and standing with them. This truth claim is essential to the Christian faith and central to the validity of Jesus' words, which claimed that he would rise after three days. It also represents victory over Satan, fuels our hope in God's promises, and provides a tangible idea of our coming destiny.

Three days after Jesus has been placed in the tomb, he was risen from the dead and took on a glorified human body. The act of rising from the dead is not something that Jesus himself accomplished, but he "was raised" from the dead by the divine power of the Triune God. The disciples and those that were following Jesus had not completely understood the breadth of his role in God's plan. The resurrection was the new beginning that convinced the disciples that Jesus truly was the Messiah, that he triumphed over death, and was divine. This added validity, also then, to the other claims of Jesus, his description of the kingdom of God, and his commandments and teachings.

Jesus appeared to the men and women that he encountered just after the resurrection and was in a glorified human body. Resurrection is not simply a matter for Jesus of returning to the completely divine nature from whence he existed prior to the incarnation. Following the incarnation and his life and death, Jesus is resurrected in bodily form, albeit glorified. We see evidence that the body Jesus has after the resurrection exhibits scars and holes that were made during the crucifixion. However, the major internal damage and causes of death have been restored and Jesus is resurrected into a renewed body.







The information above will likely be useful with the holidays close by. When you receive Christmas cards (or others throughout the year), don't throw the envelope out before you "collect the stamp".

Several years ago, the Bollers (Rick and Mary Alice) had a relative (I think) in a facility in Florida that had it's residents keep busy removing stamps from envelopes to support the work of missions. This Alliance Stamp Ministry, located in Fort Myers, FL, has been in existence since it's inception in 1971. Cancelled stamps are cut off envelopes to specifications as noted in the picture above.

Jeannette Osborne and the women of our PUMC WAM (Women and Missions) picked up this project and opened it up to the church. Since Jeannette's passing and the dissolving of WAM, Ted Passarelli and our PUMC Mission Team continue to support this ministry. Used stamps can be resold to stamp distributors, who sell them to collectors. Common stamps are sold in 25 pound boxes to wholesalers. The Alliance Stamp Ministry receives thousands of used stamps from all over the world. Stamps are divided into categories such as commemorative, foreign, love, Christmas, airmail, high value, off paper and computer generated stamps. Any type of postage stamp can be used, including torn or wrinkled stamps. One thing to remember is DO NOT soak them off the envelope. Simply cut the to the specifications above.

We hope you will join in on this ongoing missions project. There should be a container on the welcome table in the Narthex for your stamp donation. Your could simply keep them in an envelope at home, as you cut them, and bring them to church on any given Sunday. You could also put them in the Missions "mailbox" on the wall in the office workroom. Ted will take care of mailing them periodically to the Stamp Ministry in Florida. With Christmas coming, now might be a good time to get in the habit of collecting them as you bring in your

mail. It would only take a minute or two!
